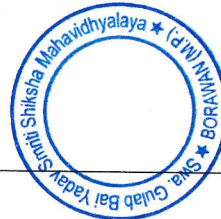

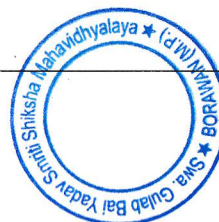

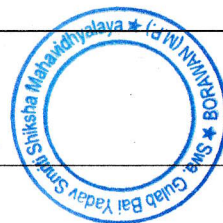

Certificate courses from SWAYAM and Mhow University are pursued by the students of the college.

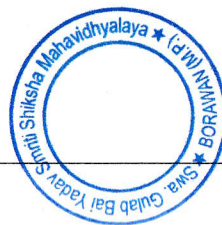
